UNTHSC School of Public Health MPH – Public Health Practice Concentration

The Master of Public Health in Public Health Practice is a skill-based program designed to prepare students to work in a variety of governmental and non-governmental settings including local, county and state health departments, community health centers, human services agencies, and other non-profit organizations. Students learn to work effectively as part of interprofessional teams to develop, manage and evaluate public health programs. Graduates are prepared to effectively engage communities as partners to strengthen their capacity to change social and environmental conditions that undermine public health and maintain health disparities.

Students in the MPH Public Health Practice concentration are admitted once a year as a cohort. Full-time enrollment is required and students are expected to graduate in five consecutive semesters. Students follow a weekly calendar of curricular and co-curricular activity that occupies 8-hour blocks of time, Monday through Friday (9 am- 6 pm). Students are prohibited from holding off-campus employment while in the program.
