Research Schmooze – Founded by the Yale School of Public Health as a method to facilitate new collaborations among faculty. The biggest barrier to faculty collaboration is that people don't know one another. Also, changes in technology reduce the opportunity for face-to-face communication. According to Gai Doran, Research Manager within the Yale School of Public Health, Research Schmooze is a social event to bring together researchers with questions, interests, and/or ideas on which they wish to collaborate. The activity provides a chance for informal networking and the opportunity to meet others with similar research interests. A date will be scheduled for Research Schmooze that will offer pre-arranged meetings with researchers, gourmet pizza and ice-cold beer, and the opportunity to share ideas.

Have you signed up through Grant and Contract Management (GCM) to use Cayuse? Cayuse is a web-based system for grant proposal preparation and submission. Cayuse can help you create a faculty profile which will allow you to create a budget for any grant proposal. Cayuse will calculate salary and fringe benefit amounts based on the salary, retirement option and insurance choice updated in the faculty member's profile. If you are collaborating with another colleague that has a faculty profile in Cayuse their information will populate too.

Strategic Planning: Research strategic planning has four stages: (1) Discovery – Research Support Needs and Recommendations (Sept to Nov 2013); (2) Environmental Scan and SWOT Analysis (Nov to Jan 2014); (3) Strategic Direction Setting (Jan to Feb 2014); (4) Strategic Plan and Logic Model (Jan to April 2014). Robyn Remotigue completed the first step, shared the findings with the Committee and Dean, and made recommendations for improving SPH research infrastructure, coordination with TPI and with UNTHSC research offices. The Research Committee will be inviting each faculty to participate in a research focus group in January to develop 3 to 4 research directions that tie to the UNTHSC strategic plan, build on our research strengths and assets, and strengthen our identity.
