What is ORCID?

ORCID, which stands for [Open Researcher and Contributor ID](#), is a free, unique, persistent identifier (PID) for individuals to use as they engage in research, scholarship, and innovation activities.

“ORCID” or “ORCID ID” can be used interchangeably.

An ORCID is a 16 digit number AND the associated record or profile, which is an associated website of controlled content.

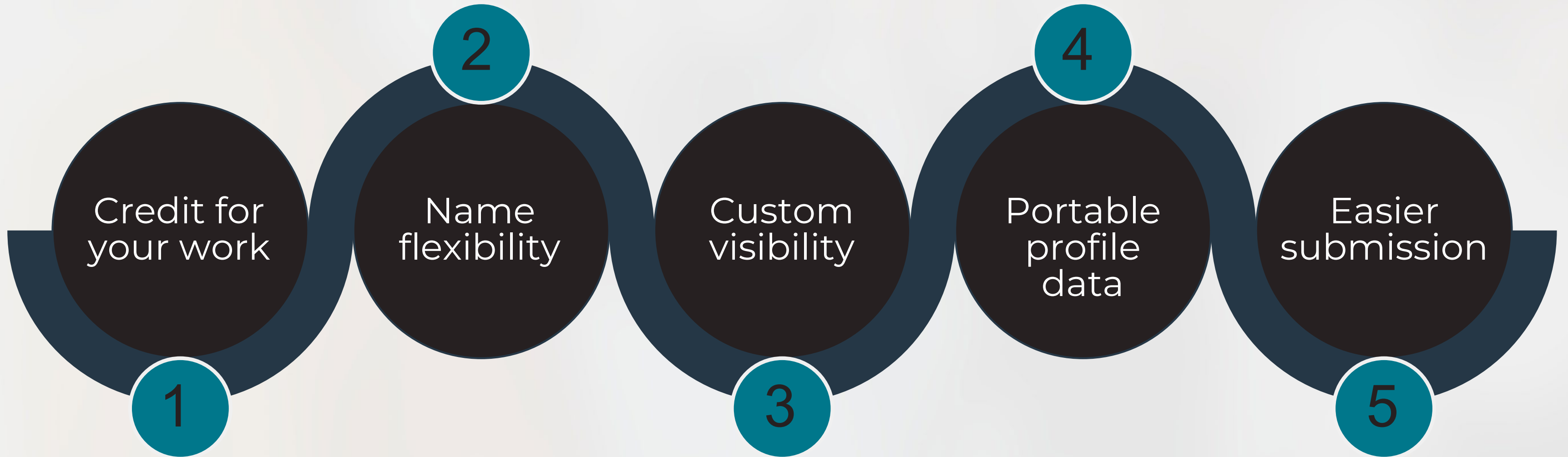

Don't risk yourself and your credit for your work while giving control of your profile to others. You can't control your data, so what happens if you have a resume or (or similar) name!

How might you use ORCID in the future?



Publications

When submitting for publication your ORCID ensures that the you are credited with your work.



Grant Applications

Many funding agencies, like the NIH, require an ORCID when submitting applications



Data Entry

Manuscript submission and grant application forms can be auto-populated when you use ORCID to log into their sites such as NIH Biosketch.



Promotion & Tenure

Promotion and tenure is often tied to publication and grant approval.



Building Connections

You can share your ORCID as well as look up presenters, authors, and potential collaborators.

Visibility settings

Your ORCID iD connects with your ORCID record that can contain links to your research activities, affiliations, awards, other versions of your name, and more. You control this content and who can see it.

-  **Trusted Organizations** (5% of users choose this)
-  **Only me** (8% of users choose this)
