## WHAT IS IT?

Students in the Primary Care Pathway Program are able to complete medical school in a seven-year, “2+1+4” plan.

- 2** years at Midland College in Midland, Texas
- 1** year at the University of North Texas in Denton, Texas
- 4** years at the The University of North Texas Health Science center at Fort Worth’s Texas College of Osteopathic Medicine

**In year 1 at Midland College, students attend a clinically oriented summer program at Midland Memorial Hospital.**

**In year 2 at TCOM, students attend a medical sciences related summer program at HSC.**

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE PCPP?

- Texas high school graduates with competitive ACT or SAT scores
- First-time college students enrolled at Midland College
- Students ready to answer the high demand for medical professionals

## WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF THE PCPP?

- One less year of undergraduate coursework and reduced overall costs of attendance
- Academic and logistic support through the CoHort model (learning community)
- Community involvement, clinical experiences and interprofessional seminars
- Successful completion of all prerequisites may result in early admission notification to medical school without taking an MCAT exam
