Element 10.1:

A COM must have policies, procedures, personnel, and budgetary resources to support the continuum of osteopathic education, including graduate medical education.

Element 10.2: A COM must provide a mechanism to assist new and existing GME programs in meeting the requirements for accreditation.

Element 10.3: A COM must provide a mechanism to assist GME programs in meeting the requirements of osteopathic recognition.

Procedure Statement: The college shall work in cooperation with the health science center to create learning opportunities that comprise formal postdoctoral training and continuing education for osteopathic medical graduates.
